



Sit down, relax, rinse and smile

This new dental practice was designed to take the fear out of visiting your dentist

et's be honest: when it comes to visiting our dentist, most of us can think of things we'd rather do. Being eaten alive by carnivorous spiders, for example.

Most dentists do little to allay these fears. Institutional green tends to dominate most waiting rooms, and those uncomfortable tubular stacking chairs don't help either.

Not at Smile. This new dental practice, located at Suntec City Mall in Singapore, was designed to minimise patients' anxieties. Director Grace Chong Tan, responsible for the design, says that her main aim was to set patients at ease.

"People tell us our practice looks like an advertising agency or a modelling agency," she says.

"That's not a coincidence. We've deliberately created a warm, cosy ambiance in our reception area."

The area features cherrywood panelled furniture and a waveshaped white leather couch. There's even a TV to distract nervous patients.

Take a closer look and you'll find

that the fitout is well detailed. For example, the handles on cabinetry are all custom made.

"The other important design element relates to hygiene and high technology," says Grace Chong Tan. "We needed to accommodate a sterilisation room and the latest equipment, from an intra-oral camera to a huge X-ray machine."

The final ingredient in this mix between cosy and high-tech is feng shui, the Chinese design rules reputed to attract good fortune.
